US Interns visit Berlin and meet with Government Officials

Halfway through their internship, 29 students from US universities gathered in Berlin for the annual US-German Internship Program Get-Together. During the two-day program, students met with state and national representatives from the American and German governments to discuss economic and trade issues that affect the transatlantic relationship. They exchanged ideas and experiences, and explored Germany's capital.

Jim McCracken and John D. Spykerman welcomed the students at the US Embassy to talk about current political and economic topics, including the ongoing trade negotiations on TTIP. During the Q&A, the diplomats shared interesting insights of their work with the group.

The program continued with a visit to the Paul-Löbe-Haus and an open discussion with

the office of Peter Beyer, MdB. Afterwards, Sieglinde von Wasielewski greeted the group at the Representation of North-Rhine-Westphalia and gave an overview on NRW as well as the state's ties to America. With journalist Dr. Christoph von Marschall from the Tagesspiegel, students talked about cultural differences between the US and Germany. To round off the official program, the group enjoyed a guided tour of the Reichstag building, including the roof terrace and dome.
